As you are aware, Lake St. Clair is currently at a historically high level. The level of Anchor Bay on July 22, 2019 was approximately 577.90 (highest level recorded). The Army Corps of Engineers is estimating that Lake St. Clair has peaked and *should* begin to slowly recede.

Sand Bags / Sand Bagging Operation: As of June 27, 2019 Chesterfield Township DPW has coordinated with residents on approximately 2.5 Million Pounds (1,250 Tons) of sand in approximately **62,000** sand bags. Our team will continue this effort for as long as it is necessary.

Coordination of Efforts: Since early May, Chesterfield Township has been coordinating solutions with our partners at Macomb County as well as State and Federal Officials. We have deployed over 20 sewer plugs and pumps throughout Chesterfield to limit the backwards flow from Anchor Bay. We are also beginning to analyze the potential effects on our infrastructure *if* the water does not recede prior to the upcoming winter. Officials from NOAA will continue to provide 'technical advice only' to our community.
